How to use this card:

Point to the symbol that tells what you want to say.

Is the word not on the card? Use the ABCs to spell it out.

If the other person points to something; speak it out and verify if it is correct.

Parent/guardian/attendant: Point to a symbol directly after or while you say the word. We call this modelling, this way the other person learns what the symbols mean (see the image to the right).
